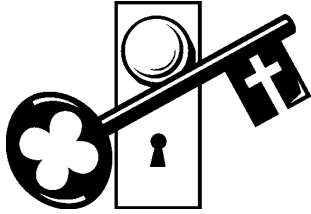


**THE OTHER SIDE”**

**FALL ENERGY APPEAL**



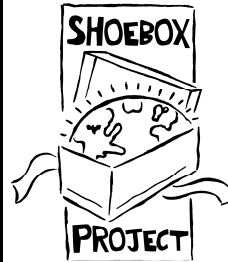
