GUIDELINES FOR SPONSORS

I understand that in order to be a sponsor for Baptism or Confirmation, I must be able to answer yes to all of the following requirements:

If I am an adult, I am a registered member of Saint Hilary Parish for at least 6 months.

I am at least 16 years of age and have permission from my parish to be a sponsor.

I have received my Baptism, Communion, and Confirmation. I presently practice my Catholic faith by attending Mass, receiving Communion, contributing to the support of my parish, and am living a good moral life.

If married, I have been validly married in the Catholic Church and am raising my children as Catholics by registering them in Catholic school or a religious education program.

These guidelines are made for the good of the child or adult being baptized or confirmed so that you may help them to live their faith commitments as Christians amid the challenges of life in today's world.
